- Nursing care for Indigenous clients with health care needs in community & hospital settings.
- Nursing care includes assessments, case management, health teaching to clients, support, consultation, liaison and referral while functioning as a member of a multidisciplinary team.
- Ensures that client self-care and independence is maintained, and participates in the administration of all Acts and regulations applicable to nursing functions.
- Travel may be a requirement of this position. Transportation arrangements must meet the operational requirements of Island Health in accordance with the service assignment and may require the use of a personal vehicle.

Requirements

Registration with BC College of Nurses and Midwives as a practicing RN/RPN registrant. Valid BC Driver's License. Demonstrate basic knowledge of Community Health & Long Term Care Services within respective geography available for Indigenous clients; Knowledge of the significance of culture in relation to individual, family and community health services; Demonstrate a basic knowledge of health and wellness services available on Vancouver Island for Indigenous patients (First Nation, Métis, Inuit); Demonstrates an understanding of Canadian colonization, Indigenous specific racism and its impact on the current health and wellness of Indigenous peoples; Knowledge of Indigenous Identify groups in Canada and the significance of place of residence for Indigenous individuals in relation to access to health programs and services; Knowledge of the significance to provision of culturally safe health care engagements and environments for Indigenous peoples; Experience with Indigenous course work and education. A minimum of two years of experience working within and with Indigenous communities. An equivalent combination of training and experience may be considered.
